### **Hellos and Goodbyes**





### **Adult Fall Programs Preview**

This Fall we have many exciting programs on the schedule for adults.

New this year is the **Meredith Public**Library Computer Club, which will meet monthly. Led by our Technical Services
Librarian, Christopher Leland, a new topic will be explored monthly with plenty of time left-over for your own computer issues. It will meet the second Tuesday of every month, with the first meeting September 13 at 10:00AM. No registration required. Open to all experience levels.

Also starting in September we will be offering a four-week Genealogy Workshop. Sign-up for one or all four classes. They will start on Wednesday, September 14 from 2:00-3:00PM and meet weekly at that time.

September 14-**Getting Started in Geneal- ogy**-Learn genealogy basics: where to start your journey, how to track your information and what resources are available at the Meredith Public Library. You will receive many different forms to help you with your research.

September 21-Using Ancestry.com Library Edition-The world-wide subscription to Ancestry is quite pricey for your personal use. Why not try using the library version for free? Search census records, passenger lists, military records and many other sources for information about your ancestors.

September 28-Using Heritage Quest and American Ancestors-Learn how to use Heritage Quest, the library's only subscription genealogy database that you can access from home, to search for US census records, pension files and genealogy related books and magazine articles. Also we will look at americanancestors.org, the database of the New England Historic Genealogical Society which focuses largely on records of New England ancestors.

October 5-Family Search and Other Free Genealogy Sites-Family Search, maintained by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, is the fastest-growing Website of free records available online. Learn how to set up a free account and search Vital Records from all around the world. Also learn about the numerous free genealogy sites available on the Web.

We will be offering other workshops this fall on using our downloadable audio and e-books, our magazine and newspaper databases and the online language learning software. Look for more information on this in our September newsletter.

We also have two exciting New Hampshire Humanities programs this Fall co-sponsored by the Friends of the Meredith Library.

Witches, Pop Culture and the Past will be October 25 at 6:30PM. In 1692 in Salem, Massachusetts, 19 people were executed and hundreds imprisoned during a witch hunt we still discuss today in everyday conversation, pop culture, and American literature. History, tourism, and performance collide when Salem tells its witch stories. "Truth"--both moral and macabre--vies with spooky thrills for its authentic place in history.

Out National Thanksgiving: With Thanks to Abraham Lincoln and Mrs. Hale will be Wednesday, November 16 at 6:30PM. Sarah Josepha Hale tells the story of her thirty year effort to have Thanksgiving declared a national holiday. President Abraham Lincoln enters at the end of her tale, to read his 1863 Thanksgiving proclamation. Sharon Wood portrays Hale and Steve Wood portrays Lincoln in this living history presentation.

Both of our book clubs and genealogy club will continue this Fall. But for now, please enjoy the rest of your summer!
