



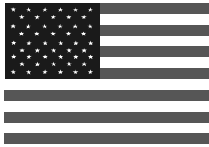

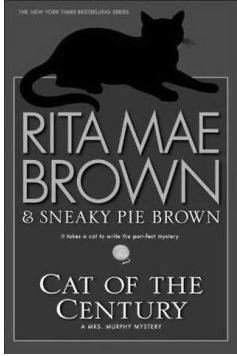

Mystery Book Group- Thursday, July 14, 10:30-12:00PM- Please join Meredith Library's Mystery Book group as we read *Cat of*

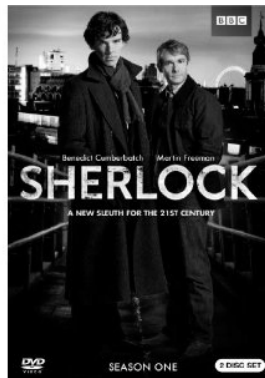
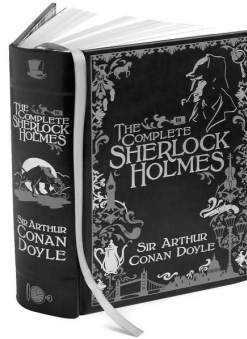

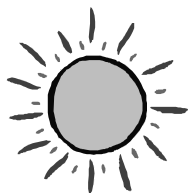
